CALIFORNIA GAMING RESOURCES

REGULATORS:

California Gambling Control Commission (CGCC)

The California Gambling Control Commission has jurisdiction over operation, concentration, and supervision of gambling establishments, and over all persons or things having to do with the operations of gambling establishments in the State of California. The focus of the Commission is to act as the regulatory body over gambling activities in the State, setting policy, establishing regulations, issuing licenses, serving as the adjudicator for license denials recommended by the Division of Gambling Control, and any other related items and issues that may come before the Commission. In addition, the Commission, pursuant to the Governor's Executive Order D-31-01, under the Tribal-State Gaming Compacts, is ordered to (1) administer the gaming device license draw process, (2) control, collect, and account for all license fees, and (3) ensure that the allocation of gaming devices among California Indian Tribes does not exceed the allowable number provided in the Compacts. Included within this responsibility is serving as the Trustee for the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund, and Administrator of the Special Distribution Fund.

Division of Gambling Control (DGC), State of California, Department of Justice

The Division of Gambling Control regulates legal gambling activities in California to ensure that gambling is conducted honestly, competitively and free from criminal and corruptive elements. The Division of Gambling Control is also responsible for tracking the identity, prior activities, and present location of all gambling enterprise employees, and for ensuring that all gambling enterprise employees hold a valid work permit. State gaming agencies and the Tribal Government work together to develop and implement a means of regulating Class III gaming on Tribal lands to ensure the fair and honest operations of gaming. The Division investigates the qualifications of individuals who work as Key Employees in the Tribal Casinos, Vendors who sell Gaming Resources to the Tribes, as well as Financial Sources to determine whether they are suitable pursuant to the Gambling Control Act (Act) (867, statutes of 1997.)

National Indian Gaming Commission

As an independent federal regulatory agency of the United States, the National Indian Gaming Commission was established pursuant to the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act of 1988. The Commission comprises a Chairman and two Commissioners, each of whom serves on a full-time basis for a three-year term. The Chairman is appointed by the President and must be confirmed by the Senate. The Secretary of the Interior appoints the other two Commissioners. Under the Act, at

least two of the three Commissioners must be enrolled members of a federally recognized Indian tribe. The Commission's primary mission is to regulate gaming activities on Indian lands for the purpose of shielding Indian tribes from organized crime and other corrupting influences; to ensure that Indian tribes are the primary beneficiaries of gaming revenue; and to assure that gaming is conducted fairly and honestly by both operators and players. To achieve these goals, the Commission is authorized to conduct investigations; undertake enforcement actions, including the issuance of notices of violation assessment of civil fines, and/or issuance of closure orders; conduct background investigations; conduct audits; and review and approve Tribal gaming ordinances.

The California lottery has multiple games. For more information on specific games please visit the website listed above. On November 6, 1984, 58% of California's voters approved Proposition 37, the California State Lottery Act. The Act provides that at least 34% of the Lottery revenues must go to public education. This supplemental funding provides schools with additional resources to meet their locally determined needs. The act specifies that the lottery is to be operated and administered by a Commission appointed by the Governor. The Legislature has the authority to amend the Lottery Act if, by doing so, it furthers the purposes of the Act.

The Office of Problem Gambling has developed a problem gambling prevention program with several services. They include telephone hotlines, public awareness campaigns, research programs, training for health care professionals, educators, law enforcement, and gambling industry personnel in identifying problem gambling behavior, identifying customers at risk, and knowledge of referral and treatment services. The Office of Problem Gambling is focused on developing a statewide plan to address the problems with problem and pathological gambling. The Office adopts necessary regulations, develops priorities for funding services and criteria for distributing program funds. It also monitors the expenditure of state funds by the agencies and organizations that receive them and evaluate the effectiveness of the services provided.
